



Lords Of Tram GKA Big Air Kite World Cup France 2025 29.03 – 27.04.2025

It is a pleasure to announce the second Big Air World Cup event of the GKA KITE WORLD TOUR 2025 which will be a held in Barcares, France.

The dates of the open window period will be from the 29th of March to the 27th of April 2025.

This is a 4-Star GKA Big Air Kite World Cup, and the competition is sanctioned and governed by the 2025 GKA Kite World Tour Rulebook.

Entry procedure and Registration

All competitors planning to enter to the GKA Big Air Kite World Cup shall pre-register and present the video application through the GKA Kite World Tour rider app under the following direct link:

or via email tom@global-kitesports.org or by other means to be specified by the GKA Sports Commission, no later than the published closing date for entries for that specific event.

Ultimately it is the competitors' responsibility to pre-register or to apply for an entry for an event and to ensure that the application has been received timely and correctly.

According to rule 11.2, fines and/or having their next events applications cancelled may be handed out to a pre-registered and/or qualified competitor who, without advanced notice fails to show up at an event.

Complete and signed entry forms for event registration must be signed and complete online after the application of the competitor got approved by the GKA Sports committee by latest one day after the preregistration period closes. Exceptions can only be granted by the GKA Representative.

If a competitor is unable to complete registration at the published time and place in the Race Notice for reasons beyond their control, then the competitor should contact the GKA Representative with details of their delay, and must gain consent for their registration period to be extended. Evidence must be supplied to support reasons showing that the circumstances were out of the competitor's control. Failure to comply with the above will prohibit a competitor from entering the event.

All riders must preregister and send the video application for the event by 23.59h of the 27th of February 2024.

All attending riders need to have a valid membership with the GKA and be members of a national NATIONAL SAILING FEDERATION and/or WORLD SAILING and have to be insured via the NATIONAL SAILING FEDERATION and/or WORLD SAILING.

Cost of entry is 125.- Euro and fees need to be paid via credit card during the online registration. Entry fee is to be paid via credit card during the online registration.





Every competitor needs to hold a valid GKA membership. The GKA membership needs to be obtained before or at the same time when confirming participation for an event and can be paid during the online registration. When not competing in their country of residence, the membership includes athletes' insurance for accident and third party liability during the competition.

The cost of the **GKA membership** is 80.- Euro for competing in one event and 160.- Euro for being able to compete the whole year.

All entry fee and GKA membership payments must be made before the **10th of March 2024** via credit card payment through the online registration tool.

Important Info

- It's recommended to wear a helmet during competition!
- All riders need to wear impact vest during the competition!
- All riders need to wear safety leash during competition!
- Competitors have to wear the official lycra at all times when proceeding to the water also during training.
- Each rider will get one competition riders' vest at the registration. Each rider is responsible for his competition riders' vests. In case of loss a replacement is not possible!
- Competitors shall wear the event advertising lycra vest supplied by the Event Organizer over all other clothing, including harness on the water at all times during the event and two (2) board sticker to be placed one on the top and one on the bottom of the board.
- All competitors are required to abide by the advertising rules as laid out in the Rule Book.
 Competitors breaching these rules may be warned in writing for the first offence and may incur a fine at the second offence of not more than \$ 500 for each violation.
- All rider meetings and opening/closing ceremonies in the schedule are mandatory to all riders.
 Please be on time and ready.
- The Riders ID-Strap authorizes you to enter the equipment storage container. You will receive the Riders ID-Strap personally and only at the registration.
- Riders are not permitted to publicly associate their names in non-authorized parties/autograph sessions.
- There will be a social event-calendar for each side event that all riders have to join via social media and share.

Membership

Every competitor needs to hold a valid GKA membership. The duration of GKA membership is from the first to the last event of the current year.

Membership fees shall be determined by the GKA at the start of the year and may be changed at any notice during the year.

At the end of the inscription-time, the rider must be able to prove a valid GKA membership. After confirmation of participation, he will receive a payment link. Payments must be made via credit card. For certain exceptions, late payments can be made in cash at the inscription at the respective event. Cashpayments will only be accepted in Euros or USD currency.





The cost of the GKA membership is 80 € for competing in one event and 160 € per year (to be paid 80 € at the first event entered and 80 € at the second event entered. The total amount of 160 € can also be paid in once at the first event for the complete year. Membership fees are excluding event fees.)

The GKA membership fee for Local / National Wildcard holders is reduced to $20 \, €$ for competing in one event and $100 \, €$ per year (to be paid $20 \, €$ at the first event entered when receiving a wildcard and $80 \, €$ at the second event entered).

The membership includes athletes' insurance for accident and third-party liability during the competition. Benefits are only provided in accordance with the current ERAG insurance policy. The GKA Kite World Tour, the GKA Event GmbH, the Global Kitesports Association e.g. cannot hold liable for any legal and/or financial liability, losses, damages, which might occur from the participation in the competition/event.

Please note that the insurance is only valid for riders not competing in their country of residence. Local riders are **not** insured through their GKA membership.

Entry restrictions

Entry-fee payments must be made no later than the end of the inscription-time at the respective event. In the case that the full amount of the inscription fee is not paid by the end of the announced inscription-time, the rider will not be allowed to compete. For certain exceptions, late payments can be made in cash at the inscription at the respective event. Cash-payments will only be accepted in Euros or USD currency!

In order to enter the event, parental consent / authorization must be received for all competitors who are under the age of 18 years old at the registration date.

Eligibility

A competitor is eligible for any GKA event if he meets the following conditions:

- He/she has a personal medical insurance with worldwide coverage. A valid membership card or certificate, or other satisfactory evidence of worldwide medical coverage may be requested.
- The competitor cannot hold the GKA, the GKA Event Gmbh or the event-organizer responsible for any claims for damages as a consequence of the competitor not having sufficient personal medical insurance.
- The competitor cannot hold the GKA, the GKA Event Gmbh or the event-organizer responsible for any legal liabilities and/or any claims for damages by third parties caused by the competitor.
- He/she holds a valid competitor's membership with the GKA Kite World Tour

Entry allocation

24 MALE RIDERS:

- The top 10 Big Air male riders from the current GKA Big Air World seeding list are already prequalified
- Top 10 video applications will be selected by the GKA sports committee.
- 2 entries will be via the GKA Wildcard invitation.
- 2 entries will be via the Lord Of Tram Organiser Wildcard invitation.

12 FEMALE RIDERS:

• The top 5 Big Air Female riders from the current GKA Big Air World seeding list are already prequalified.





- Top 5 video applications will be selected by the GKA sports committee.
- 1 entry will be via the GKA Wildcard invitation.
- 1 entry will be via the Lord Of Tram Organiser Wildcard invitation.

For GKA wildcards the KWT Sports Commission will select competitors based on their participation in International Big Air Competitions as well as their kite merits.

To enter via Video application Ranking, competitors must submit their video applications through the riders app.

GKA wildcards and video entry wildcards competitors will be seeded by draw.

If any of the competitors cannot compete in this event due to an injury or other reasons, the empty spot will be given to the next ranked rider in the qualification group (either GKA ranking, wildcard or video application).

The GKA will publish the wildcard allocation and the selected video applications on 04th March 2025, a few days after the preregistration period closes.

<u>Video Contest Format Guidelines – Twintip and Surfboard</u>

• **1 VIDEO** - 1 Rider = 1 video clip. The riders do have the option to remove/update/replace a video with a newer/better before the video entry closes, but only one video per rider will be scored. This can be done via the GKA rider app.





- 4 MOVES Each rider can include a maximum number of four jumps/moves in each edited video. (No
 further judgment will be made after the fourth move is shown/completed.)
- **3 BEST** Best 3 scores counts The panel will judge the video clip on GKA Big Air Judging Criteria based on three different categorized tricks/jumps.
- VARIETY Variety in the jumps and move-selection is extremely important. Repetition of similar jumps (and/or tricks) could result in lowering scores.
- TAKE OFF & LANDING Each filmed trick shown in the video clip MUST include the rider's start, the
 execution and the landing. Make sure that take-off is clearly visible as well as the landing. If the takeoff/landing is cut off or removed it will reduce chances of consideration from the panel. (No take-off or
 landing = No score.)
- **FOCUS** Do not split the video-clip/camera-angles at mid-jump. The clip will need to show and follow the entire jump from take-off to landing. No slow-motion playback; regular speed playback only.
- **EDITING** No fancy editing required. Raw unedited will also work. Videos do not need to be a masterpiece of editing; all we need is to clearly see the potential of the rider and the value of the moves.
- **LENGTH** Max 1 minute The video clip cannot exceed 60 seconds (1.00). We are not looking for long video clips (clip can be shorter but no further judgment will be made after 60 seconds or after the fourth move is shown/completed).

What is not allowed:

- INSTAGRAM No Instagram videos allowed.
- **POV SHOTS** No point of view videos, line, mouth, board, kite, harness mount-cam footage, as it does NOT show the real perspective (height and length) of the jump and the period in air. Also, no drone shots from a FPV/ follow drone.

Disciplines

There will be one official disciplines in this GKA Big Air Kite World Cup - TWIN-TIP BIG AIR

Divisions:

- Pro Men: any age (minimum 14 years old in the year of competition)
- Pro Women: any age (minimum 14 years old in the year of competition)

Seeding

The seeding for the GKA Big Air Kite World Championship 2025 in Baraces, France will be according to the 2024 Big Air seeding list. this is based from 50% end of year 2024 result and 50% from the first 2025 event in Jericoacoara.

Weather:

The average maximum daytime temperature in Port Leucate in April lies at 17.0°C (62.6°F). The average minimum temperature is 7.8°C (46.04°F). The sea Temperature is averagely sits around 13.8°C in April.

Wind direction:

Tramontana north west winds blow offshore at the competition spot. The crew will look to run competition in 30 knot+ conditions.

Event Schedule

With the event window being 1 month long the event could happen at any given moment. Lord of Trams and GKA will coordinate with its selected riders when competition could possibly start. As soon as a suitable forecast is on the radar competitors will be informed and green light for the competition will be given a minimum 48 hours before the start.

Inscription and briefing will happen on the day before the competition. Times to be announced.

Prize giving will take place right after the final on the same day as competition.





Be aware that times of competition can change and will depend on weather conditions. Participants will be regularly updated on the riders WhatsApp group.

Prize money

The prize money for the GKA Big Air World Cup Twintip, Barcares France 2025 will be **10.000 Euro.** The prize money is paid cash or bank transfer by the organiser to the competitors in line with the Rulebook.

18.000 Euro will be paid to the winners of the event and 1.000 Euro (10% of the event prizemoney) will go to the first 3 male and female winners of the GKA Big Air World end of year ranking, World Championship Title.

The prize money distribution for a valid and completed KWT event will be done according to the following table:

If there are 16 or more competitors in one gender and less than 16 competitors in the other gender, then the prize split will be as followed:

40% of total prize money are split between Top 4 women
 40% of total prize money are split between Top 4 men
 20% of total prize money are split between Positions 5-8 of the gender with more than 16 competitors (4 riders in equal 5th place)




If the women's or men's division doesn't take place, the full amount allocated as prize money will be added to the one and only division.

Judging Big Air Discipline

Judging procedure

- The general judging rules are located in Chapter 21 of the GKA Kite World Tour Rulebook 2024.
- Judges shall award each competitor's trick scores on a scale from 0.1 to 10.0, broken into one-hundreds increments (e.g 6.44).
- The scores of the respective competitors shall be tabulated together to determine the winner: highest points wins.
- The maximum number of trick attempts and the trick scores counting towards the final result per competitor during a heat will be announced by the Head Judge and posted in the Official Notice Board at least thirty (30) minutes before the start of the heat.

Ties in Big Air Discipline heats

• In case of tie in the Big Air format, it will be broken in favor of the competitor with the highest total trick score, excluding the Overall Impression score if there is any. If a tie remains between two or more competitors, it will be broken in favor of the competitor with the highest single score. If a tie remains between two or more competitors, each competitor's individual scores counting towards the final score shall be listed in order of best to worst, and at the first point where there is a difference the tie shall be broken in favor of the competitor with the best individual score.

Big Air Trick categories

- The tricks repertoire has been broken down in a number of categories. The list of tricks included by
 category is not extensive, and not limited to the described tricks in appendix C2 but gives an
 indication about how different tricks are being categorized by the judges. The Head Judge has the
 final say when categorizing a new trick.
- In order to bring the variety criteria into effect, if a trick is repeated or if it is an evolution of the same trick (i.e. added rotation), only the highest score from those will count towards the final heat score from each competitor.

Judging Criteria

The GKA Big Air judges evaluate each trick on their execution and smoothness, emphasizing control from start to finish, clean landings, risk factor, innovation and explosivity.

- Height and amplitude The combination of height and amplitude of the tricks completed during the heat. As the wind conditions increase, this aspect will exponentially become more and more into consideration, but only when the height and amplitude are achieved along with risk factor and technical difficulty.
- 2. Technical Difficulty The technical difficulty of tricks completed during the heat.





- 3. Commitment and Risk Factor Pushing the limits under control will increase the chances of winning the heat. The Risk factor is the commitment of the competitor and physical challenge during the execution, duration of the critical moment, and energy on the execution.
- 4. Other judging criteria such as variety, "wow" factor, smoothness, innovation, free falling, tricks landed vs crashes, will affect the overall impression.

In summary, this contest focuses on Big Air, and we are eager to witness authentic Big Air manoeuvres.



GKA Kite World Tour

- 1. As a competitor, I agree to respect the racing rules and in particular:
- 2. To display visibly the sailing-number attributed to me.
- 3. To always wear the official event-competition-lycra when proceeding to the water (also during training) as well as during interviews, official presentations and on podium.
- 4. To wear a life jacket and safety helmet during the competition,
- 5. To follow the recommendations and/or instructions provided by the crew.
- 6. To always place board stickers (GKA Kite World Tour & Event sponsor) on the top and on the bottom of the board during the event (competitions, interviews, media conferences, award ceremony...).
- 7. To take note that all rider meetings, opening/closing ceremonies, and media conferences requested by the Event Organizer are mandatory to all riders. I assure that I'll be on time and ready.
- 8. I'm aware that a non-observance of this rule will incur a fine of up to 500 USD. Any competitor finishing in the top 3 positions who fails to attend the awards ceremony on time without being justified by a force of major circumstance will incur a fine equal to their earned prize money for the event. Furthermore, fine can incur an additional penalty of up to 1.000 USD and suspension for the next event.
